### **Book Group report**

# Q&A - Vikas Swarup

This is the first novel by Vikas Swarup an Indian diplomat. It tells the story of Ram Mohammad Thomas a young waiter who becomes the biggest quiz show winner in history, only to be arrested and jailed accused of being a cheat.

He has a very poor start in life as an abandoned baby and throughout the book we hear of the various episodes in his life and the experiences that help him answer questions in the "Who Will Win A Billion"

He tells each adventure to his lawyer and every chapter finishes with the actual question that he can answer correctly because of his previous life. We are immersed in the survival of a street boy in India with the extreme differences in wealth and opportunities. We hear about the exploitation of women, the vast divide that exists between social classes and abuses of power.

We all enjoyed this book despite the chapters not following a linear time line of Ram's life. He is proved not to be a cheat and is awarded most of the money. Though revolving around the idea of winning money on a quiz show the themes culminate in a powerful commentary on what it is like to live a life of poverty in India.

You will recognise this as the basis for the Danny Boyle film "Slum dog Millionaire". But those in the group that had seen and enjoyed the film agreed the book told the story differently and in greater detail.
