Book Group recently read "The Long Walk Home by Val Wood."

One of main characters is Mikey who and his family are really poor and hungry, so he steals rabbits from a butcher's shop to feed them and is caught and sent to prison. On his release decides to leave Hull and seek his fortune in London together with two other characters in the book. The other main character is Eleanor, daughter of a well to do family, brought up by a strict father, who controls her mother and brother, Eleanor's father has little compassion for the poor whereas Eleanor does.

In London Mikey meets up with the wrong kind of people who finds him work. In the meantime, Eleanor finds out that her father is charged with wrongdoings, her mother has left her father for a new life and is not interested in her daughter. Eventually Eleanor and Mikey decide to return to Hull together.
