Leek, Brussel Sprout & Carrot Soup

1 med. Shallot or small onion Knob of butter Potato approx. 115g/4oz Carrots approx.. 115g/4oz Leek 150g/5oz Brussel sprouts approx.. 200g/7oz Chicken or vegetable stock cube in 400ml hot water Salt and pepper to taste

Remove outer leaves & base from sprouts, cut in half and rinse in cold water.

Discard base & outer leaves from leek, cup up into chucks.

Peel shallot/onion & slice fairly thinly. Peel potato & carrots & cut them into small pieces.

Put butter into saucepan over a low/med heat. Add shallot/onion, stir well & cook for a minute stirring constantly. Add potato, carrots, sprouts & leek, stir & mix well.

Add stock, increase heat & ring to boiling point. Reduce heat and leave covered, simmering gently, stirring occasionally, for 15 minutes or until vegetables are fairly soft. Strain off most of the liquid into a jug.

Put vegetables into a liquidiser or use a hand blender and whizz until pureed. Return liquid to pureed vegetables in a saucepan, stirring gently to mix well. Season to test.
